Executive Insight: May 2025

From the Desk of Sheena Fardell, Head of Government and Industry Affairs & Acting CEO

Dear Members,

While Hermione has been off galivanting around Europe, it's been a productive month across the ALC network and the broader freight sector.

Following the re-election of the Albanese Government, we've re-engaged with government and media to ensure freight priorities remain central to the national agenda. In recent pieces for ATN and Daily Cargo News, we've called for the release of the updated National Freight and Supply Chain Strategy

— that will focus on productivity measures, drive decarbonisation, ensure regulatory consistency, and guide infrastructure investment.

The updated Administrative Arrangements Orders have shifted key responsibilities — cities, land, and planning policy now sit with Treasury, while Infrastructure retains funding and financing. This change has implications for how freight and industrial land use are considered in broader planning. ALC is engaging with both departments to keep freight access, corridor protection, and planning integration front of mind.

This month we held ALC's Annual General Meeting and Council Meeting, hosted by Intermodal Terminal Company (ITC) at their Somerton precinct in Melbourne. The forum brought together Councillors and senior officials from Queensland, Victoria, and NSW to focus on a major national issue: unlocking rail's potential.

Using ALC's new Rail Issues Discussion Paper, the session addressed how fragmented governance, outdated modal assumptions, and disconnected planning constrain rail's role in supply chains. The discussion highlighted the need to shift from internal rail reform to systems thinking — focusing on integrated, outcome-driven freight solutions. Many thanks to ITC for their hospitality and for fostering a space to explore how rail can be better reintegrated into efficient, multimodal networks.

ALC also featured prominently at CEDA's 2025 Climate and Energy Summit. Our CEO, Dr Hermione Parsons, joined industry leaders from Aurizon, the Port of Melbourne, and Bioenergy Australia to discuss freight decarbonisation. The message was clear: we need scalable renewable fuels, refuelling infrastructure on key corridors, and nationally consistent policy — and ALC is advocating for coordinated action.

As the new government begins its term, our focus remains on keeping freight central in economic, infrastructure, and environmental policy. We'll continue working with members and decision-makers to push for reform that strengthens Australia's supply chains and delivers real outcomes.

ALC Board and Council Meeting

Thank you to Intermodal Terminal Company for hosting the ALC Council Meeting at their world-class Somerton facility. It was an ideal setting to bring industry leaders and senior government representatives from Victoria, New South Wales, and Queensland together for robust discussion on national freight priorities. Our agenda centered on the critical issues shaping the future of supply chain: intermodal connectivity, infrastructure investment, and policy reform. The roundtable session, *Transforming an Outmoded Modal Paradigm*, underscored the importance of taking a systems-led approach to national freight strategy—one that supports a modern, efficient and resilient network. The Council also received an update on the refreshed ALC Strategy 2025–2027, which reaffirms our role as *the independent, trusted voice of the modern supply chain for Australia*. The Strategy focuses on four key pillars: productivity, resilience, sustainability, and sector visibility. Strong engagement from members and stakeholders reflects the shared momentum across ALC's strategic initiatives. The Council Meeting once again demonstrated the strength, unity, and forward focus of Australia's freight and logistics community. Thank you to all who contributed to the success of this important event.

ALC meet with Jeroen Weimar & William Tieppo

ALC recently met with Jeroen Weimar, Secretary, and William Tieppo, Deputy Secretary, of Victoria's Department of Transport and Planning, to discuss Victoria's freight infrastructure priorities. The discussion centred on the need to protect and activate industrial land, enhance freight corridor connectivity, and ensure planning frameworks are responsive to the increasing demands of the state's supply chains. ALC welcomed the opportunity to share industry insights and engage on practical measures to support Victoria's vital role in the national freight and logistics network.

CEDA's Third Annual Climate and Energy Summit

ALC CEO Dr Hermione Parsons contributed to CEDA's 3rd Annual Climate and Energy Summit, emphasising freight's critical role in Australia's decarbonisation journey. Dr Parsons highlighted structural barriers to freight decarbonisation, including infrastructure gaps, limited renewable fuel supply chains, and regulatory inconsistency. ALC reiterated the need for national freight decarbonisation masterplans, strategic energy infrastructure along freight corridors, and collaborative government—industry investment to deliver sustainable, scalable outcomes.

ALC Meets with Mick Power, Senior Adviser to the Minister for Climate Action, Energy & Resources and the State Electricity Commission

ALC met with Mick Power, Senior Adviser Senior Adviser to Minister D'Ambrosio at the Office of the Minister for Climate Action, Energy & Resources and the State Electricity Commission, to discuss Victoria's Climate Change Strategy. The conversation highlighted the freight sector's critical role in achieving net-zero emissions by 2045, with a focus on renewable energy integration, infrastructure resilience, and workforce development. ALC emphasised the need to align freight policy with climate objectives to ensure a sustainable and competitive supply chain—contributing to Victoria's leadership in climate action.

ALC Member Workshop: Shaping the Load Restraint Curtains Guide with NHVR and Engistics

NHVR is updating the Load Restraint – Using Rated Curtains guide, originally developed in collaboration with ALC and Engistics. ALC recently hosted an exclusive member-only workshop with NHVR and Engistics to review the draft and seek member endorsement. The updated guide will reflect current technology, best practice, refreshed graphics, a new format, and include a dedicated section on curtain repairs. Member feedback from the session will help ensure the guide remains practical, clear, and fit for purpose — supporting improved safety outcomes across the freight task.

Trusted Information Sharing Network (TISN)

ALC attended a TISN cross-sector briefing led by the National Office of Cyber Security (NOCS) on sector-specific Cyber Security Playbooks. Developed under Shield 4 of the 2023–2030 Australian Cyber Security Strategy, the playbooks provide guidance on national coordination during significant cyber incidents. The Transport Sector Playbook outlines how NOCS supports both industry and government responses.ALC encourages members to report incidents via ReportCyber and review the relevant playbooks to strengthen cyber preparedness across the freight and logistics sector. ALC Attend ANCAP's Light Truck Safety Briefing

ALC recently joined ANCAP for a Light Truck Safety Briefing to discuss the evolving safety standards of light commercial vehicles. The session covered key topics including crash performance, regulatory alignment, and vehicle design. As light trucks increasingly support last-mile freight, safety ratings are becoming an essential factor in procurement and fleet investment decisions. Insights from this discussion will help shape the formation of a dedicated Safety Expert Network, aimed at driving better safety outcomes, fostering industry collaboration, and enabling evidence-based advocacy to strengthen light vehicle safety across the supply chain.

Statewide Policy Engagement on Industrial Lands

ALC has engaged with the NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure on the development of a Statewide Policy on Industrial Lands. This engagement builds on ALC's March submission in support of Action 1 under the Industrial Lands Action Plan and complements related Departmental work on the industrial land supply pipeline and the Employment Land Development Program. The recent submission focused on the proposed categorisation of industrial precincts, policy content, implementation guidance, and planning interventions. This work reinforces ALC's ongoing advocacy for freight-accessible, fit-for-purpose industrial land and a more coordinated approach to land use planning and infrastructure delivery across key freight corridors.

National Access Framework for Heavy Vehicles Working Group Meeting

ALC participated in the latest National Access Framework for Heavy Vehicles (NAFHV) Working Group meeting, focused on advancing access reform initiatives across jurisdictions. Industry representatives discussed progress on Ministerial Guidelines, the national PBS network, third-party engagement strategies, and data-led infrastructure assessments for low- and zero-emission vehicles. Insights from the meeting will

inform the NAFHV reporting framework and broader access improvements. ALC continues to support collaborative national efforts to streamline access and strengthen freight productivity and safety.

Policy Updates

ALC Advocates for Freight-Focused Transition in NSW EV Infrastructure Inquiry

ALC lodged a comprehensive submission to the NSW Legislative Assembly Committee's Inquiry into Infrastructure for Electric and Alternative Energy Vehicles, urging a freight-focused approach to Australia's transition to low- and zero-emission transport. ALC warns freight cannot be retrofitted into passenger-oriented systems and calls for purpose-built infrastructure, including high-capacity charging and hydrogen refuelling at key freight hubs. The submission also advocates for harmonised regulation across jurisdictions, stronger protection of industrial land, and recognition of low-carbon liquid fuels as essential in the near to medium term. It calls for intensified action to shift more freight onto rail and highlights the need to include marine operations in electrification plans, alongside a coordinated workforce transition to support emerging technologies. This submission is part of ALC's broader mission to ensure the freight sector is central to Australia's clean transport future.

Supporting Driver Health Is Critical to Workforce Retention

ALC lodged a submission to the National Transport Commission on Improving Health Screening for Heavy Vehicle Drivers—a key opportunity to support driver wellbeing and address freight workforce shortages. The current screening framework is fragmented and inconsistent. ALC is calling for nationally consistent, fair, and transparent requirements, better aligned with industry operations. Our submission highlights the importance of combining regulation with practical, non-regulatory programs. We strongly support Healthy Heads in Trucks & Sheds and their trusted on-road screening initiatives, which help drivers access preventative care without fear of penalty. Key recommendations include: Nationally consistent screening for MR licence and above; formal support for Healthy Heads' initiatives; integration of mental health indicators; and clear privacy protections and follow-up care.

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Change in NSW electric freight infrastructure needed

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National health screening requirements a 'priority'

In a major boost for domestic manufacturing and freight decarbonisation, Volvo Group has announced plans to build heavy-duty electric trucks at its Brisbane facility from 2025. The move reflects Volvo's commitment to regionalising production to strengthen local supply chains and reduce emissions. Linfox has signed on as one of Volvo's largest customers, taking delivery of the first 10 of 30 electric trucks as part of its long-term sustainability strategy. Backed by a \$19.6 million ARENA grant, Linfox continues to expand its electric fleet and green distribution infrastructure across key cities. This collaboration highlights the freight industry's growing focus on emissions reduction and domestic capability - key pillars of ALC's 2025–2027 Strategy. As pressure mounts globally for cleaner, more resilient supply chains, Australia is stepping up through targeted investment and member leadership.
